

THE AIM OF THE COMPETITION IS TO PROVIDE YOUNG CREATIVE TEAMS THE POSSIBILITY TO PRODUCE PIECES OF MAXIMUM 20 MINUTES IN LENGTH WHICH ARE SUBSEQUENTLY PRESENTED PUBLICLY WITHIN A ROW OF PERFORMANCES AT NEUKÖLLN OPERA.

FOR A NEW OPERA

The Berlin Opera Award stands for a broader definition of opera, formulating relevant themes using various means of music theatre (e.g. performance, lively installation, etc.) Thus, it is open towards all kinds of compositions and instruments, such as sampling, laptops, and electronic devices.

FOR ARTIST COLLECTIVES AND INDIVIDUALS

Collective work is more typical also within the world of theatre than individual artists. We would like to encourage this social aspect of the creative process. Consequently, the Berlin Opera Award is not only available for individual artists but also for artist collectives, such as performing groups, bands, produc-

THE PROCEDURE

THE COMPETITION CONSISTS OF THREE STAGES:

STAGE 1 – APPLICATION

Sie reichen

a) An already existing performance or dramatic piece accompanied by music (extracts are also accepted). This should include some sort of audio-visual media and a conceptual paper in case of performances; and scores and audio materials in case of dramatic pieces. The submitted material should give us an impression of whether you are capable of creating an interesting and performable piece within the conditions of the competition.

b) A detailed proposal for a 20-30-minute-long piece to the theme NEW DEAL, which may be performed by the artist group itself or by artists of Neukölln Opera. The collective may consist of maximum 7 participants.

Based on the submitted materials the jury is going to choose 6 concepts for a workshop.

STAGE 2 – WORKSHOP

The chosen teams name maximum 2 representatives to present their concept. They also gain a deeper insight into the way Neukölln Opera operates, its dramaturgy and preferences; and the submitted concepts are to be discussed with the participants of the jury.

FOR MUSIC THEATRE WITHIN A DI-**GESTABLE DIMENSION**

Small-scale music theatre with its socially interested, small format is both artistically and socially an alternative to most of the pieces being played nowadays and to the way they are being performed. Neukölln Opera represents the former approach like no other theatre does within the German-speaking territory.

BERLIN OPERA AWARD – AN AWARD FOR THE DOERS

- it is aimed at young artists with stage experience who are interested in the non-dogmatic forms of music theatre
 - is meant to facilitate the artistic treatment of music for stage pieces
 - contains a production grant of 10,000 Euros / Awardees and a row of maximum ten performances
 - is open to all genres of music theatre including musicals

STAGE 3 – REHEARSALS AND PERFORMANCES

The jury chooses maximum 3 awardees of the submitted pieces. They are invited to prepare their piece in a 3-weekrehearsal-process. Neukölln Opera provides technical and professional support during rehearsal and performance, as well as production management. The production budget is distributed based on the mutual approval of Neukölln Opera and the artists. The debut performance takes place in a special setting (Awarding Gala), during which the jury determines the ranking order. Subsequent performances are staged in the studio of Neukölln Opera and are part of the repertoire. The performers receive a compensation for the performances, based on the usual performance fees within our theatre.
